 and honorably in the Army of the Republic of Texas, for the term of
Months, from the Twenty third day of December
1835 until the Twenty seventh day of
March 1836 and having been killed with the
 Command of Col. Fannin at Goliad, 27th March 1836, his heirs are
 entitled to Nineteen hundred and Twenty Acres
 Bounty Land, for which this is his CERTIFICATE.

And the said heirs of John Donoho
 is entitled to hold said Land; or to sell, alienate, convey and donate the same; and to
 exercise all rights of ownership over it.

In Testimony whereof, I have herunto set my hand, at Austin
 this thirteenth day of September 1847.

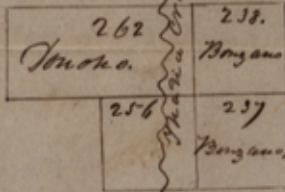
